Lyme Regis Fossil Festival

The Lyme Regis Fossil Festival is an annually sponsored 3-day festival across 8 venues in Lyme Regis, attracting more than 10,000 visitors of different ages and backgrounds, offering a networking opportunity for professional and amateur earth scientists, as well as engaging young people in earth science.

The 2015 Generation Science tour reached 63,357 pupils in all 32 of Scotland's local authorities, representing over one quarter of all primary schools in the country. The team of expert science communicators took inspiring and confidence-building science to schools across the length and breadth of Scotland, providing 1,666 shows and workshops.

A weekend of talks, workshops and excursions designed to inspire and support the teaching of the Earth Sciences, providing delegates with the opportunity to learn from experts at the University of Cardiff and at the National Museum of Wales. The outcomes of the conference were published in *Teaching Earth Sciences* 41.1.



Almost 75% of PESGB's budget has gone to the funding of MSc's in Petroleum Geology. The second largest proportion has gone towards external charitable purposes.
